- 1. Where in the essay do you state your belief? Write the essence of the belief in 5 words or less.
- 2. Are you making strong and precise word choices? Provide a sample of some of your strong words below.
- 3. Does your essay tell a story? How does the story tie to the shaping of your belief? Does it stray into tangential information that lessens the impact of the essay?
- 4. Your essay must stay positive. Does it preach or editorialize? Avoid using sweeping generalizations employing the collective "we." State your belief, **NOT** what you don't believe.
- 5. Read your essay **aloud** to yourself. Does it sound like you? Are you using words and phrases that are comfortable for you to speak? Now, read it aloud again; simplify and edit your essay until you find the words, tone, and story that truly echo your belief.
- 6. Proofread your essay for spelling, capitalization, punctuation, and usage errors.
