What is an expository essay?

An expository essay communicates the significance of a central idea or insight that has deep personal meaning to the writer

How do I begin?

- Listen to samples from *This I Believe* on www.npr.org.
- Identify one of your personal beliefs.
- Experiment with different types of leads.
 - * Question When was the last time you were kind to a stranger?
 - * Quotation "Be happy," were my mother's final words to me.
 - * Strong Statement If you eat enough candy, you will be happy.
 - * Metaphor My life is a puzzle with some pieces missing from the box.
 - * Description The pink curtains, the pink carpet, the pink bedspread: it was as if someone had vomited Pepto-Bismol over the entire room.
- Be certain your main idea (BELIEF) is clear to your audience.
- Write your essay using **active verbs**, **not passive**.
